A Ritz in Spain, a palatial retreat at Versailles and a Pig in West Sussex. Susan d'Arcy has the pick of next year's openings

EUROPE

1 Nature Eco Residences Greece

Santorini is Europe's honeymoon capital but it's not just newlyweds who need some rose-tinted romance right now — so this eco-hideaway, opening in May, feels timely. It hits the spot for warmth, with an earthier mood board than the typical Cyclades white-onwhite starkness and has panoramic views of the all-important caldera. Better still, it's not in tourist-trap Oia, first stop for selfie-obsessed couples, but in quieter Akrotiri, where sharpelbowed, mood-killing photographers are rarely spotted.

2 Matild Palace

Hungary
If you've been to Budapest, you already know this belle époque beauty down on the Danube beside Elizabeth Bridge. It is a city landmark whose weddingcake interiors have been given some 21st-century attitude thanks to cutting-edge art and contemporary furniture. The drama continues upstairs, where the III bedrooms have handcrafted bedheads and bathrooms inspired by the country's famous thermal spas. The

crowning glory is the Duchess, its (not very) secret rooftop bar named after Princess Maria Clotilde, who commissioned the palace and

demanded a speakeasy drinking den on the roof to entertain her artist friends.

3 Villa Igiea Italy

The renowned hotelier Rocco Forte loves Sicily and he has had his eyes on this seaside-meets-city palazzo in Palermo for years. In its heyday the art nouveau masterpiece played host to Greta Garbo and Grace Kelly. From June — courtesy of some ▶

▶ Forte fairy dusting — that bygone glamour is back with a bang, particularly in the hotel's frescoed bar. The parquet floors, Sicilian tiles and Carrara marble bathrooms in the 104 bedrooms have also been spruced up, but there was no need to tamper with their heartwarming views that tumble down to the Tyrrhenian Sea Details B&B doubles from £465 (roccofortehotels.com). 4 Oku Balearic Islands

This newcomer, arriving in May, sits neatly in the pine-clad hills just above the bay of Cala Gracio, where you'll find Ibiza's loveliest beaches and best sunsets
— the perfect accompaniment to its brand of boho luxury. There's an organic wholesomeness to the natural stone and reclaimed oak in the 189 rooms that makes you want to roll out your yoga mat, yet in true White Isle style there's plenty of opportunity to retox too. A resident DJ keeps the vibe jumping at the pool, which at 50m is the longest on the island, and San Antonio's nightlife is within walking distance. Details B&B doubles from £275 (okuhotels.com). 5 Casa Pacha **Balearic Islands**

Ibiza's mega-club Pacha has decamped to its quieter neighbouring island of Formentera to open a hotel that swaps decadent beats for healthy hedonism. The 14-room property launches in April on photogenic Migjorn Beach with an aesthetic that is raw rather than roar. That means sun-bleached fabrics, polished concrete floors and tropical plants. Mindful "happenings" include sunset rituals and fire dances, but if that is too tame, guests have complimentary entry to Pacha on Ibiza too.

6 Hotel Ritz Spain

Madrileños will tell you that César Ritz merely cut his teeth in London and Paris, and Madrid's Ritz is the pinnacle of his holy trinity. Their grande dame, a stone's throw from the Prado and Thyssen-Bornemisza museums, has been under wraps for three years while undergoing a £100 million renovation and its March opening is eagerly awaited by locals and visitors alike. The hotel's 153 rooms have been given a contemporary polish, but the revitalised Palm Court is causing the most buzz — its original glass dome, hidden for the past 80 years, is being reinstated, making this the place for a supreme people-watching afternoon tea. 7 Palacio de Canavezes **Portugal**

The Douro Valley may be known for its wine, but its water has fans too and in the 1900s Portuguese royalty enjoyed dipping in its mineral-rich thermal springs. From May Gordon Campbell Gray, a master of low-key minimalism, provides the base for sampling those liquid assets in style once again. His 52-room wellness resort is all about the healing H2O. Water is a central pillar of its medical clinic, which focuses on baths and hydrotherapy massages. The restorative spring water is blended into the spa's lotions and fills the outdoor pool, which overlooks a languorous swish of the River Tamega.

8 Hotel Castello di Reschio Italy

Waking up in this 11th-century castle is like starring in your very own fairytale Count Antonio Bolza and his family bought it in 1994 as a romantic ruin with a woebegone 3,700-acre estate attached. After a blood, sweat and far-too-many-years restoration, their hilltop fortress outside Perugia welcomes its first guests in April. Interiors are entrancing, filled with covetable furniture by the count's son Benedikt, an internationally famous designer. The estate has also been nursed back to its best so you can spot wild boar, roe deer and even porcupines. etails B&B doubles from £610 (reschio.com). Fly to Florence

9 Revivo Wellness Resort, Château de Fiac France

Revivo operates one of Bali's best spas, but this château in Tarn, southwest France, offers the same excellence minus the jet lag. The emphasis is on brain as well as body so expect neurobics workouts for your grey matter, meditation to boost neuroplasticity and art therapy for cognitive creativity, while your food plan will be personalised from a DNA screening. Elsewhere the earthy tones and floral fabrics of the 16 elegant bedrooms should boost your mood, and since the hotel's 200-year-old wine cellar has been transformed into a curative salt cave, there will be no losing brain cells to the demon drink either.

10 Grand Universe Lucca, Autograph **Collection** Italy

Lucca has always played second fiddle to nearby (and overrated) Pisa, but the arrival of the first luxury hotel in its old town might just change the fortunes of this charming medieval walled city. The Grand Universe opened last month with 55 sharp-lined modern bedrooms, knockout views from its rooftop bar and some cute heritage nods. Lucca was the birthplace of Puccini, so the hotel has employed an in-house composer, ready to create a short piece of music inspired by your sparkling personality. 11 The Woodward Switzerland

The renovation of this post Haussmannstyle mansion on the shores of Lake Geneva is top-notch. Pierre-Yves Rochon, the design guru behind George V in Paris, is in charge of readying the 26 swanky suites for its spring opening. They will come with flamboyant touches such as marble bookcases as well as views of Mont Blanc. The food will be just as noteworthy given it is by Michelin-starred Joël Robuchon. Wellness is by Maison Guerlain and even its swimming pool will make a splash. At 21m it's the longest in the city. Details Doubles from £1,270

12 Mob House France

The philosopher turned hotelier Cyril Aouizerate, who co-founded the Mama

Shelter brand, hates the words "hipster" and "boutique", which is ironic given they neatly describe his latest project. Mob House opens in April in the increasingly gentrified Paris suburb of St Ouen in the northern arrondissement of St Denis with 100 rooms that mix smart Italian furniture with flea-market finds and views of the Sacré-Coeur. There's a 25m pool in the garden and a restaurant overseen by an as yet unnamed renowned chef offering classics such as ragout for as little as a fiver. Let's hear it for égalité and fraternité.

13 MarBella Elix Greece

MarBella's two Corfiot resorts have carved out a reputation for being among the Med's best affordable luxury stays. Their new mainland stablemate won't let the side down when it opens in April. It shares the same high design values and emphasis on great dining, with a fresh fuss-free modernity for its 146 rooms and four restaurants covering the Med's







culinary bases. It also has a peachy setting near Parga overlooking the sublime sands of Karavostasi beach Details Half-board doubles from £121 (marbella.gr), Fly to Preveza

14 Airelles Château de Versailles — Le Grand Contrôle France

For the first time the third estate can stay at France's grandest palace, Versailles — or at least in the château's former, equally lavish finance ministry in the grounds. Guests will have out-ofhours access to the site as well as electric boats and golf carts to help them to explore its 2,500 acres. They will also be able to join behind-the-scenes palace tours to see rooms such as Louis XVI's dressing room and Marie Antoinette's private library, usually off-limits to

day visitors. Sleep is probably the last thing on their minds, but when they must, the 14 rooms are so excessive they'd bring a smile to Louis XVI's face four-posters, antique

furniture, authentic chandeliers. The hotel opens next year with the chef Alain Ducasse producing suitably OTT menus, including a Marie Antoinette afternoon tea with plenty of you know what.

15 Arthaus Beirut Lebanon

Art lovers Nabil and Zoe Debs have already turned their homes in Windsor, Megève and Havana into culturefocused guesthouses. The fourth property in their collection was always going to be special: this 18th-century mansion in Beirut has belonged to Nabil's family for generations, but then it ended up opening on August 4, the day an explosion ripped through the city, killing 200 people. The couple have regrouped, repaired and will reopen next month with 25 eclectically decorated bedrooms and an underground lounge offering the inside track on the local arts scene Details B&B doubles from £165 (arthaus.international). 16 Bethlen Estates Romania

Transylvania is Europe's last true wilderness and until now something of a desert for stylish accommodation. This curation of meticulously restored houses in the medieval village of Cris gloriously rectifies that situation. Their crisp interiors are layered with urban sass thanks to designer furniture. Tom Dixon lights and sculptural staircases. Outside remains timeless, with the Carpathian Mountains' untamed forests, glacial lakes and Renaissance castles on the doorstep.

17 Patina Maldives

For years the Maldives was tourism's WC Fields — the comedian who joked that anyone who hates children can't be all bad - but the destination is becoming increasingly family-friendly. Those with 2.4 in tow should check out Patina, which opens in April. It sports the understated decor synonymous with the archipelago but here it comes with complimentary ice cream, free loan of bikes, snorkelling kit, stand-up paddleboards and kayaks and even one gratis dive lesson per child. Nights are rounded off round a communal campfire with an endless supply of marshmallows to toast.

18 Capella Hanoi Vietnam

Bill Bensley's whimsical Alice in Wonderland interiors have made him the darling of the design world and he hasn't held back with his latest project, steps from Hanoi's Opera House. Riffing off the city's mischievous opera-goers from the Roaring Twenties, the 47 bedrooms dazzle with art deco detailing. accessorised by more than 1,000 pieces of musical memorabilia. The theme continues with the Diva's Lounge bar serving Twenties-inspired cocktails, and Backstage restaurant, draped in

performers' costumes, where the Vietnamese cuisine based on 100-yearold recipes hits all the right notes. Details B&B doubles from £515 (capellahotels.com). Fly to Hanoi

19 Azumi Japan

It takes someone of the calibre of Adrian Zecha, who founded the superexclusive Aman chain, to take on the challenge of reinventing the ryokan. His contemporary version of the traditional inn opens in March on Ikuchijima island in the Seto Inland Sea, nicknamed Japan's Mediterranean because of its sunny climate and turquoise waters. The hotel is built round a 140-year-old family home, with Zecha adding modern drama to the serene, light-filled bedrooms by surrounding their private gardens with eye-catching cedar fencing. In keeping with the ryokan's community ethos meals will be taken communally and the hotel's bath house will be open to local people. A must-do detour for those bound for the delayed Olympic Games. 20 Hutton Brickyards United States

The post-Covid yearning for countryside is not unique to the UK. New Yorkers are also upping sticks and their dream destination is the Hudson Valley for its fine art, fine dining and even finer festivals. From April this country estate opens on 73 riverfront acres in Kingston. the valley's creative capital, with 31 Shaker-chic cabins that have corrugated iron roofs, tongue-and-groove walls and woven flags to raise to signal a roomservice request. Similarly civilised pursuits include archery and croquet. Details Room-only doubles from £145 (salthotels.com). Fly to New York

21 Six Senses Botanique

While we head to Brazil's beaches in summer well-heeled Brazilians make a beeline for Campos do Jordao in the Mantiqueira Mountains, hungry for its pure pine-scented air. Six Senses' eco-resort, opening in early 2021, keeps indoors authentic too. The seven suites are decked out with indigenous warm woods and have floor-to-ceiling windows for maximum impact. Activities include classes in capoeira, the Afro-Brazilian martial art, plus hiking and horse riding through forests and valleys, while spa guests can forage for botanical herbs to use in their treatments.

22 Soho Beach House **Canouan** Grenadines

The Caribbean's playful take on barefoot luxury aligns exactly with the UK's favourite party-hard hotelier so it's surprising that it has taken Soho House more than 20 years to find a home here. That said, Canouan Island is the perfect match. It's as drop-dead gorgeous as the group's supermodel fans and even more exclusive than its sister-island Mustique. The 40 whitewashed bedrooms open early in 2021, within an easy sashay of a pearlwhite beach where you might swim with turtles in water that's so Tiffany blue it could be the Maldives.
